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Personally Owned Devices

Fairfax County Public Schools is committed to assisting students and staff in creating a 21st century learning environment. In progress, students and staff will now be able to access our wireless network with their personal devices during the school day. Students may register and use their own devices to access the internet and collaborate with their peers. If we use their own technology at school, we are hoping to increase the access all students have to technology.

Why are we doing this?

Applications accessed by a web browser, such as FCPS Google Apps for Education, eliminate the need for a student computer. Cloud based computing allows students to access their information from any internet connection. This requires unique strategies to ensure every student has equitable access to technology.

Student Personal Devices

Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, students are permitted to bring their own electronic devices to school for instructional use. Use of student-owned devices is restricted to instructional activities under the direct supervision of a teacher. All devices must follow the policy stated in the AUP while on school property, attending a school activity, or using a school network.

A permission form is to be filled out for all devices approved throughout the school year. If you are interested in bringing a device to school, please contact your child's teacher for more information.

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Personally Owned Devices Policy

The Fairfax County Public Schools Department of Information Technology has recommended to principals that students be allowed to bring their personally owned computing devices to school for use in the classroom as an instructional tool. Personally owned computing devices, include smartphones (such as iPhones and Androids), laptops, netbooks, tablets (such as iPad, Xoom, Galaxy Tab, etc.), and e-readers that have Wi-Fi capability.

GCM agrees that these devices can enhance the instructional program, and will allow students to use



permission, in the way only be used in accordance with the "Acceptable Use Policy" posted in classrooms.

Students are responsible for any device they choose to bring to school. When not in use in the classroom, the student is responsible for properly securing the device. Teachers and other staff will not store or hold onto devices. School technology staff will not support, repair or troubleshoot student devices. Students should fully charge the device prior to bringing it to school. Students are responsible for providing an opportunity or the necessary power to charge the device during the school day.

Students must follow these steps:

1. "Personally Owned Computing Devices Permission Form." Students should carefully read the entire document.

2. The student must sign and date page 3.

3. The student must include all the requested information for each device. *If students are unsure how to obtain their Mac Address,

In order to continue to provide for increased access to technology as a tool for learning, we have begun to allow 5th and 6th grade students to bring personal laptops and e-readers to school for instructional use. Participation in this initiative is strictly optional, at the discretion of each family. On this page are permission and information forms for families and resources that students may want to download for use.

Basic Parameters & Expectations:

Form for ALL digital devices and information for parents
Netbook, tablet or laptop w/working wireless, USB port, flash drive (optional), power supply, current antivirus/spyware software

Laptops:

- Laptop will be at school daily
- Notebook sleeve (small portable case for storing/carrying)
- Recommendations: Microsoft office
- Laptops will be stored in classrooms
- use will be at teacher direction/discretion during instruction
- students follow IUP policy signed at start of school year, new IUP will be signed
- no email or IM communication during school day
- suggested software: Photostory, Audacity, Google Earth (see links below)

E-Reader:

- Parent permission form must be on file with school before an e-reader may be used

PERSONALLY OWNED COMPUTING/NETWORK DEVICE ACCEPTANCE OF RESPONSIBILITY AND DEVICE USE AGREEMENT PERMISSION FORM

The purpose of this document is to inform parents, guardians and students of the rules governing the use of personally owned computing/network devices while on or near school property, in school vehicles and at school-sponsored activities, as well as the district's technology resources via remote access.

Please read the following information carefully before signing the attached permission form.

Introduction

Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) is pleased to offer students access to district computers, the Internet and an array of technology resources to promote educational excellence. Each student is responsible for his/her use of technology whether personal or district-provided. While using district or personal technology near school property, in school vehicles, and at school-sponsored events, as well as using technology resources via remote access, each student must act in a manner consistent with legal guidelines. It is the joint responsibility of school personnel and the parent or guardian to educate the student about his/her responsibilities and to establish expectations when using technology.

Using FCPS Technology Resources

The information systems and Internet access available through FCPS are available to instruction, and support school system business practices. FCPS information systems are for the benefit of all users. The use of the FCPS network is a privilege, not a right. Users should not do anything that might disrupt the operation of the network or equipment and/or interfere with the work of other FCPS employees.

The FCPS network is connected to the Internet, a network of networks, which enables millions of networks and computers. All access to the FCPS network shall be preapproved by the network manager. The school or office may restrict or terminate any user's access, and action is deemed necessary to maintain computing availability and security for other users.

What is BYOD?
During the fall of 2011, FCPS developed a framework for embracing and managing the use of personally owned computing devices within FCPS. This framework quickly became known as BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) and parents are encouraged to allow their students to register and bring in their personally owned laptops, netbooks, tablets, and smartphones to school for authorized instructional use.

Why BYOD?
The introduction of BYOD allows for increased:

One primary motivation for BYOD is to allow students to bring in personally owned computing devices to support increased student access to online digital instructional resources.

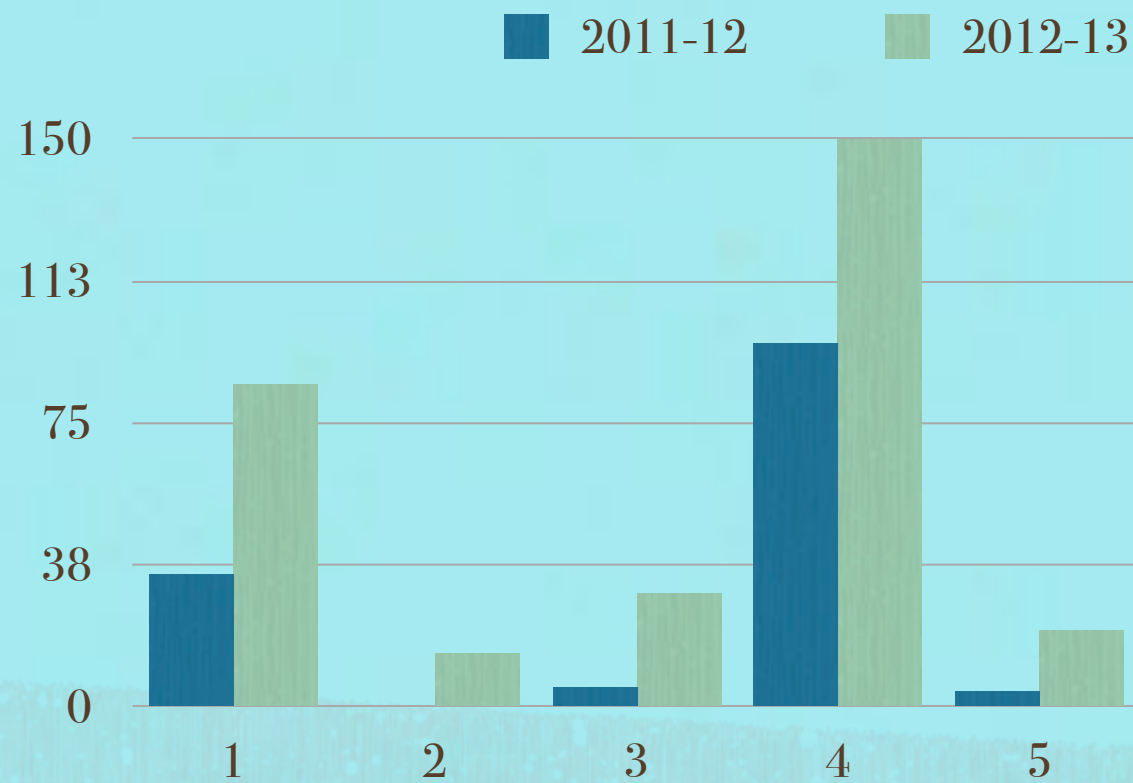

Many students also use their devices to take notes, to complete assignments, to create study tools, and to collaborate with other students and teachers.
