 - a. Vocaroo.com
 - b. Audioboo.com
 - c. Recordmp3.org
 - d. Sound Recorder in Windows
 - e. Garageband (for Mac)
- 2. Upload it to a feed (optional) (not free) Libsyn / Cyberears
- 3. Give hyperlinks to the audience!


Supposta's


Sample Consultation cont.

Recommendation #1 - High Contrast in Windows - Based on our conversation and observation of this student it seems like the student needs for text to appear larger on the screen. Furthermore, a background color other than white seems to help the student attend to content.
